Mass grave Kozluk

The Kozluk 1 site is a primary grave exhumed in 1999 and located adjacent to the River Drina near the town of Kozluk. The site has been used as a rubbish dump and for gravel extraction. The Kozluk 1 site was at the north of the suspect area. Aerial images made available to the ICTY indicate the Kozluk mass grave site was created between 5 July and 17 July 1995. Aerial images also indicate a further disturbance of the site prior to or on 27 September 1995. ICTY investigators were present at the scene.

The Kozluk 2 site is a primary grave exhumed in 1999 and located adjacent to the River Drina near the town of Kozluk. The site has been used as a rubbish dump and for gravel extraction. The Kozluk 2 site was at the east of the suspect area.

The Kozluk 3 site is a primary grave exhumed in 1999 and located adjacent to the River Drina near the town of Kozluk. The Kozluk 3 site was in the southwest of the suspect area.

The Kozluk 4 site is a primary grave exhumed in 2015 and located adjacent to the River Drina near the town of Kozluk.
